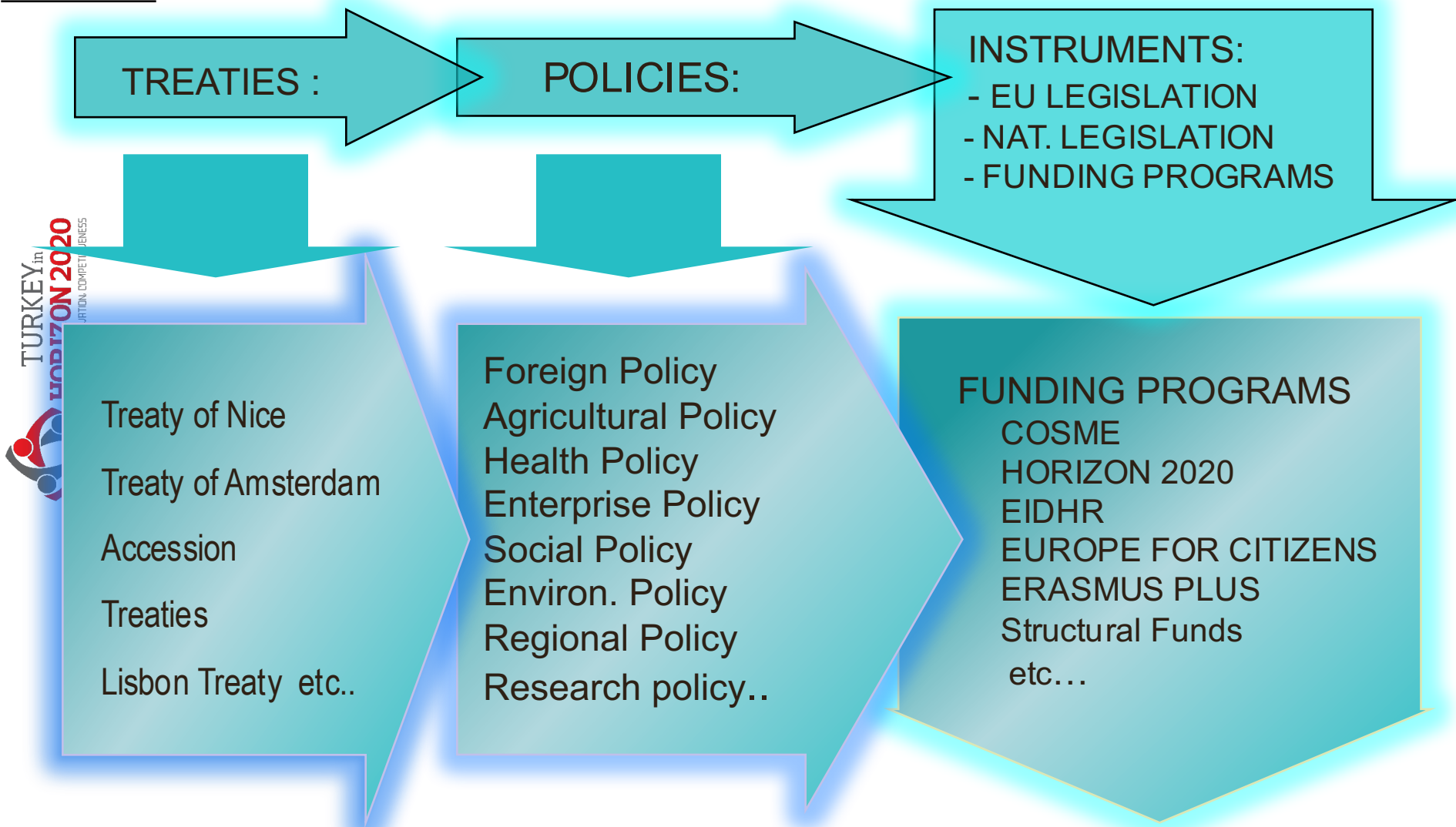

How EU funding programmes work



EU Policy and H2020

- Horizon 2020 is Programme implementing EU RTD policy.
- It is composed of number of pillars which are in live with EUROPE 2020 strategy.
- All projects has to realize EU policies in different areas.
- References to the EU policies are important element of each proposal: it should be proved that project is relevant to H2020 objectives and EU policies.
- Topics of H2020 are not created bottom up, they are following identified problems (challenges).
- However, there are components of H2020 which are following bottom up uproach (for example: FET, MSCA, ERC).

How to analyze effectively the expectations of the EC

➤ **Creation of a Project Environment Folder (PEF)**

Download and copy relevant policies, work programs, reference documents, problem/challenge/market/industry analysis, research results, national strategies and other relevant non-state initiatives important for your project idea

➤ **Creation of a Customized Application Form (CAF)**

Create a CAF for your project using the Application form, Guidelines For Applicants (GFA), Evaluation criteria and paragraphs, sentences and words from the reference documents.

Creation of the Project Environment Folder

- Download into PEF all relevant documents (and share them):
 - **Policy level:** EU Policies, strategies, action plans..
 - EU Funding **Programme level:** work programme, action plans, guidelines, FAQ ...
 - **Project level:** problem/challenge/market/industry analysis, research papers, publications, project models..
 - **National, Regional and Local level** (if relevant), and
 - Other relevant NGO initiatives important for your project idea
 - ..

Documents supporting proposal preparation

- **Project objectives:** identify relevant policy documents and/or analytical documents; start from documents mentioned in WP;
- **Relation to the work programme:** identify key elements of the WP text and make references;
- **Concept and approach/ambition:** analyse state of the art using relevant projects (CORDIS), publications, patents and market studies;
- **Impact:** EU, national, regional and local development strategies, in particular S3 strategies; quantified data (referenced to impact in WP) taken from existing studies;
- **Horizontal issues:** follow the guidelines published on Participant Portal; make reference to relevant studies.

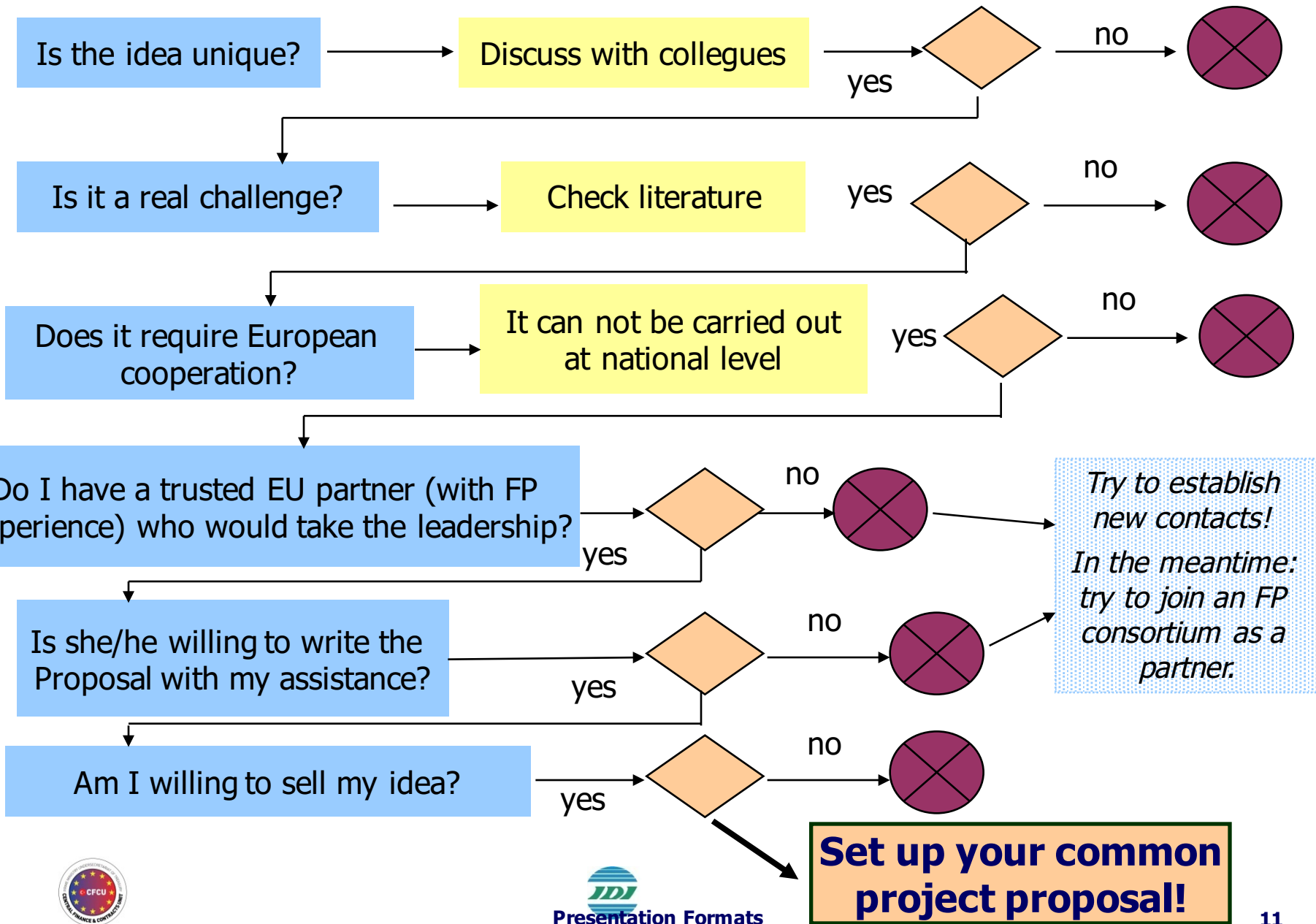


What makes a good proposal?

When analyzing idea, ask the following questions:

- ❖ **What problem are you trying to solve?**
(the topic in the call is the problem defined by the EU and your project is the solution)
- ❖ **Is it a European problem?**
(can not be carried out at national level)
- ❖ **Why this project now?**
- ❖ **Why you? Are you the best people to do this work? Who will be the competitors?**
- ❖ **Is this idea relevant to H2020 Work programme? Is it possible to make it relevant?**
- ❖ **Are objectives realistic?**
