SE novelties under MSCA (vs. H2020 MSCA RISE)

- Up to 1/3 of the total funded secondments within EU/MS, can be from the same sector (under the condition that they are interdisciplinary).
- Simplification: minimum duration of the secondments 1 month independently of the institution where secondees go.
- Action duration is the same but the number of person months is now
 360 (€1.656 Mio€) instead of 540 (2.484 Mio€) of RISE
- Open Science aspects evaluated under Criterion 1 Excellence
 & Criterion 3 Quality and efficiency of implementation



Tips and tricks

Closely follow the call requirements

Be in line with the action's objectives and expected outcomes

Follow available guidelines

Use the structure provided in the template and address all the evaluation criteria

Highlight the EU dimension

Show that your proposal addresses EU policy priorities and/or societal challenges

Get a second opinion

Have your proposal proofread by a colleague and pre-screened by your NCP




